

The purpose of the fund is to provide encouragement to persons who show aptitude and diligence in their music studies, particularly but not exclusively the piano. Applications for bursaries are invited from music students.

Please Note: The amount available for disbursement in **2019** is **\$2,323.45**. As funding is limited and the Trustees are only able to award a small number of bursaries each year, it is suggested that music teachers invite applications from students they feel most meet the requirements listed below.

IMPORTANT: The applicant completes Part 1, and then the teacher completes Part 2 and forwards the completed form intact to the address below.

Applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

- 1) Be permanent residents of the Yukon;
- 2) Be able to satisfy the Trustees of their interest in and intention to pursue further music studies in the Yukon;
- 3) Be able to demonstrate any or all of the following:
 - a) Talent (auditions are required and will be held on May 25th, 2019 at Westmark Whitehorse Hotel & Conference Centre!
 - b) Financial Need;
 - c) Dedication.
- 4) Must have completed at least one year of music lessons;
- 5) Limited to Grade 5 and under, Royal Conservatory of Music or equivalent, and age 13 and under;
- 6) Only eligible to receive an award for a maximum of two granting years;
- 7) All applications shall be accompanied by a recommendation from a bona fide music teacher.
- 8) Applications for the above Fund are available from and must be returned to:

- 9) The funds are invested with the Yukon Foundation. Under procedures instituted by the Foundation, the successful applicants as selected by the trustees must send in a form to the Yukon Foundation (to be received by May 31, 2019) and the cheques will be issued directly by the Yukon Foundation.
- 10) N.B. Under Revenue Canada rules regarding the distribution of scholarships, recipients must have a Social Insurance Number (SIN) in order to receive an award cheque.
- 11) Bursary winners will be invited to the lunch meeting of the Rotary Club of Whitehorse at **noon on Friday, June 14 at the Westmark Whitehorse**, when they will have an opportunity to perform for

club members. Each winner may also bring their music teacher plus one parent/guardian.



Applications must be returned to Frank Curlew 112 Falaise Road, Whitehorse, YT Y1A 3B2 and must be received by May 23, 2019. No late applications will be accepted.

The following are conditions for this bursary:

- 1. Auditions are required and will be held on May 25, 2019 from 2 to 4 PM at Westmark Whitehorse Hotel & Conference Centre. Students must play two contrasting short pieces (3 minutes maximum total). For instruments other than piano accompaniment is not required.
- 2. Performances must be from memory.
- 3. Limited to Grade 5 (RCM) and under; age 13 and under.
- 4. After having received a Bursary in two different granting years, an individual becomes ineligible for any further bursaries.
